### INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMINISTERING THIS INTERVIEW SCHEDULE

Please read through this schedule before using it, to make yourself familiar with the questions, layout, etc.

Instructions for the interviewing Y.E.O. are written in italics. The actual questions to be read out are in **bold type**. Please adhere to the wording and order of the questions given. Many questions are pre-coded. In these questions you are asked to circle the number against the appropriate answer. You may have to question a youngster a little further to enable you to classify his answer more easily. But do not read out the pre-coded answers as suggestions, except where the instruction "show" is given. This is most important, as otherwise uncontrollable bias may be introduced.

Questions 95-106 are for you to answer yourself. Please do not answer them in the youngster's presence.

Please start the interview with the following introduction, together with any other comment you

feel appropriate to the particular youngster:

"As you know, you are one of a group of 5000 young people all over the country who have been followed up since they were born in March 1946 by this National Survey. I expect you remember that when you were at school you occasionally had a form to fill in, or you had to have a special examination by the doctor. Well, now that you have left school the survey people would like to know how you're getting on, and they've asked me to ask you some questions about what you've been doing since last year. It isn't a test, it's just to give us an idea of what's happened to you since you left school.

Everything you tell me will be treated as confidential information, none of it will go into the records here, or to your employer, or to anyone else except the survey people. And remember, there are no right or wrong answers to these questions, I just want you to give me the answers that are true for you."

#### ADMINSTRATION OF PERSONAL QUESTIONNAIRE Y Ib

When you have completed question 94 of the schedule, introduce the Personal Questionnaire Ylb

with the following comment:"Now I'd like you to answer some questions for yourself. Some of them you might think are a bit more private than those I've just asked you, so when you've finished put the form in this envelope and stick it down. If you don't understand what a question means I'll try and help. Where a question has got several possible answers, like this, [show example] what you have to do is to put a circle round the number against the answer that is right for you. Try and answer all the questions.

Please try and arrange for the youngster to fill in the form in a quiet place. Make sure he has something to write with, and give him an ordinary 9" x 4" envelope on which you have written, plainly, "Strictly Confidential", "National Survey", and his name and reference number as on the top of this booklet.
